Dear Church,

Tuesday we have the national election...and local elections...and as I watched actual tv one night, I was really surprised at the focus, locally, on the race to elect Barbara Bollier. She's currently a state senator, a democrat, seeking to become a Senator for Kansas on the national level; a Democratic Senator, replacing retiring Senator Pat Roberts who has been the Kansas representative in the senate for more than 20 years. Running against Bollier is Roger Marshall, a man who has served one term as a state representative. He's a Republican along the lines of Senator Roberts.

What surprised me was the back-to-back ads these two people ran. The ones during prime time television were attacks from the Republicans on Barbara—her desire to vote for an agenda definitely opposed to the Republican agenda. Her ads were more along the lines of what she has done, agreeing with the accusatory actions of the Republicans, her ads reframed her actions as positives.

It was an interesting juxtaposition of truth. Both agree she stands for, votes for, creates legislation around the same actions. Their perception of those actions, the way the ads presented her work, however, was completely different. The republicans denounced her actions as "not the values we have as Kansans." The democrats uplifted her actions as the voice of the majority, the work people need on their behalf in Kansas. They both agreed she would continue the same work on a national level.

No matter how you will vote, the idea that a truth can be both positive and negative, the idea that your perception of the truth changes based on where you stand, is imperative to serving as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Truth in God is based on knowing that God is love.

Paul writes, "¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin." (Romans 3: 19-20) No matter your beliefs, you will not win your way into heaven, into God's kingdom or God's favor by following the laws and boundaries you put around people or ideas. God doesn't justify us because of who we are. God justifies us because of who God is...and God is love.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus. (Romans 3: 21-26)

We are made right with God as God loves us. Period. No matter if you stand on the right side or the left, no matter if you are liberal or conservative, no matter if you vote one way or another.

As a person who claims faith in Jesus Christ, as a person who claims to be redeemed by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, you are not responsible for your salvation. That is God's work alone. Paul says it this way, "²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law." (Romans 3: 27-28) Faith is a gift to us through the Holy Spirit (see the explanation of the third article of the Apostles' Creed). Disciples are called to respond in faith to share God in the world that others might come to salvation through Christ.

Jeremiah prophesied that we would know right and wrong in our hearts, that God has written the covenant of love on our hearts and we are called to live into that awareness in our actions, our thoughts, our concern for our neighbor. God gifts us with the ability to see a bigger picture than that which our ancestors teach even as their words gift us with ideas and perceptions. It is ours to claim the right to question and to wonder, to wrestle and to hear in our very beings the truth that God gifts to us, a truth found only in love of God, our self, and our neighbor.

The thing is, your vote does matter, your voice is important. As Christians, our first allegiance is to God, God who is love. With prayer and with deep awareness, I pray you listen to the voice in your being that offers you the peace that only comes from God and that you vote to allow that peace to continue through you into the world. Knowing that ONLY to God are you accountable, may you stand in Christ and act as God calls you to act, that the world might also know the unbounded love of God.

God of justice, in the midst of this election season we pray for fair and just elections. We pray for the healing of divisions that cause violence, and repent of the times we fail to see Your face in our neighbor. Activate our love for all of your creation and our neighbors as we exercise our right to vote and make choices about our leaders. We also pray for those who cannot vote, but whose lives are impacted by the results. Help us to be the body of Christ, an identity that claims our lives regardless of political leadership. Especially over the next anxious week, we pray for your peace, a peace rooted in justice through your Holy Spirit we pray, Amen.

CHURCH NEWS

Last Wednesday, Council met and talked about worship for our congregation. Having consulted on the exchange rate of the air in the sanctuary and looking at the continually rising cases of COVID-19 in our county and in adjacent Saline County, we are not opening worship up to everyone all at once as we had hoped to be able to do. However, we decided that the information Ida, our Office Administrator, gathered in the last weeks via emails and a few phone calls (having left many messages), we will send invitations by going through the list, top to bottom, and ask if you can come the week you are next on the list. We will have a limited number of people in the sanctuary on Sunday morning, around 10, to livestream the service. There will be no communion and we will sing with people placed (based on how many in their group) more safely (according to guidelines) around the lower portion of the sanctuary.

No one is obligated to come. Everyone is welcome to be in the rotation. This is not the "way things have always been." However, since we have been recording worship, we have had anywhere from 4 to 15 people in the sanctuary for recording so this does not seem out of character with how we have been doing things, we are simply expanding the pool of people who come to be the congregation for all of those who prefer to worship more safely at home.

Please watch for an invitation in your email. If you want to be included on the "interested in in-person worship" list, please let Ida know either by email or by phone. It is important that we continue to reach for the new normal in a way that allows us to continue be God's people in our community. We are stronger together, gathered into One by God who loves us and asks us to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. I am always looking for suggestions and for creative ways to have worship reflect our mission of sharing the faith of our fathers in the words of our children.
