In John's gospel, the feeding of the five thousand leads to extended teaching in which Jesus identifies himself as the true "bread of life." Finally, in these verses, he makes a connection that would not be understood until after his death, in light of the church's celebration of holy communion.

[Jesus said,] ⁵¹"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." ⁵²The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" ⁵³So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. ⁵⁴Those who eat my flesh

Wider Church by Jeanne Ahlers

With all the problems confronting our lives these days -- COVID, political crises and more -- it's easy to lose track of what's going on in the rest of the world. But life is going on, with other kinds of crises, some of which never reach the news media.

In the previously peaceful rural community in the Sahel region of Africa, for instance, Adama lived with his family, his wife, Jeneba, and other relatives, including their unborn child. Terrorists ransacked their community. Adama's father was kidnapped and has not been seen or heard from since. They fear he has been killed.

Adama and his family, also including his mother and grandmother, fled, with little more than the clothes on their backs. They, along with 223 other families, have to pay an exorbitant rate

just to pitch a tent in someone else's field. To pay that rent, Adama has had to sell every goat, sheep and cow he owned. He is growing onions on a small patch of borrowed land outside the camp, but the money he earns selling them is barely enough to survive on.

Added to this, the family has to worry about the coronavirus. The families who escaped the terrorists' violence are living in extremely crowded conditions. Adama is terrified that Jeneba and the child she is carrying will get infected.

But their most desperate need is food.

Lutheran World Relief is asking for support, not just to put food on the tables of families like Adama's, but to help such families to learn new farming techniques so they can raise crops in dry lands and make the most of what little access they have to water. A gift today will help them survive.

WEEKLY MILESTONES CARING CONVERSATIONS

DEVOTIONS

Read: John 6:51-58.

John's Gospel does not have the words adapted for the Lord's Supper that one finds in Matthew, Luke, or 1 Corinthians. However, here you have Jesus speaking in terms that clearly reflect the Lord's Supper. John's Gospel interprets the meal's significance as a new manna, the bread from heaven that the Israelites received in the wilderness. While the Israelites would continue to complain and turn away from God, those who receive Jesus in the Lord's Supper, the bread from heaven, will live forever. They will abide with Jesus and Jesus with them. Jesus, as the bread from heaven, binds us together as the community of disciples. Such is the power and meaning of this meal for all generations. In the Lord's Supper Jesus has a relationship to his followers and his followers enjoy a relationship to each other. How does the Lord's Supper strengthen your relationship to other Christians? How does the Lord's Supper help you in your relationship with Jesus?

Pray: **Living God, we thank you for Jesus and the Lord's Supper that binds us to him, to one another, and to the promise of eternal life with you. Amen.**

SERVICE

Sharing a meal together is a valuable way to nurture relationships. Invite friends, family, especially those who live alone to have a meal with you, so that you may get to know them better and bless them with your care. Talk about your recent highs and lows and then pray together.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Ephesians 5:19 encourages us to "*sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your heart.*" Think of some of your favorite hymns, children's songs, and psalms from the Bible. Sing them, read them as an offering to God, or listen to them online as music strengthens you in your life of faith.
